

Kate Carney was a creator in the theatre. As a young woman, she put herself through college and went on to perform on stages throughout the U.S. and abroad. As a storyteller, she created a series *Heroic Women You Can Talk To* for school-aged children to interact with characters like the *First Woman Doctor in the West* and *Paul Revere's Mother-in-Law* to "hear, feel, and understand what it was like to live in another century." The Kate Carney scholarships honor her inspiration to children of all ages.

She did further work with Jerzy Grotowski in Poland, Marcel Marceau in Paris, and Viola Spolin in Chicago. A member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, Kate performed throughout the U.S. and abroad. She mentored aspiring performers at colleges, universities, and professional venues.
